

German Language Courses

All the courses (except TestDaF Preparation) are available throughout the year.

General Language Course

20 classes per week (à 45 minutes)

The main goal of this course (all levels throughout the year) is to improve your communication skills; this means that we will give you many opportunities to speak in class. We train your listening comprehension skills with special exercises and you will have the chance to improve your powers of expression in written German. Working in small groups (average 6-8, max. 12 people), you will quickly make progress in German.

For the purposes of the visa, our standard course is treated as an intensive course as the extra afternoon activities (on phonetics, history etc.) are counted as an integral part of the course.

Intensive Course

30 classes per week

We recommend this course for those who want to learn very quickly. It includes the Standard/General language course in the morning plus 10 lessons in a mini-group (2-4 people).

If there is only student of a certain level to take an intensive course, he/she will get 5 individual lessons per week instead.

In the afternoon classes you decide on the contents, topics and exercises and the teacher will be able to help you individually. Afternoon classes are so arranged (10 classes on 4 afternoons or 5 classes on 3 afternoons) that you can participate in the leisure programme.

Intensive Course Plus

25 or 30 classes per week (20 classes in the General Language Course and 5 or 10 individual classes specialised language in the afternoon);

German for doctors/nurses, Translation, Business German, German for tourism, other specialised languages: flight attendants, secretary, ...

Business German (Intensive Course Plus)

25 or 30 classes per week (20 classes in the General Language Course and 5 or 10 individual classes specialised language in the afternoon)

German for Tourism (Intensive Course Plus)

25 or 30 classes per week (20 classes in the General Language Course and 5 or 10 individual classes specialised language in the afternoon)



Exam Preparation Courses (Intensive Course Plus)

Our experienced and qualified teachers prepare students for any German language exam, including telc, TestDaF and medical German for doctors and nurses.

Like Intensive Course: The topics and exercises are geared to the particular style of question of the exams.

Translation Course (Intensive Course Plus)

25 or 30 classes per week

As examination preparation for students of German, trainee-translators and other interested parties. Students of the same native language work in small groups on the translation into German of newspaper articles, literary and other texts. The teachers' mother tongue is of course German with an extensive knowledge of the foreign language in question. Languages normally offered are: English, French, Spanish, Italian. Other languages by arrangement. If requested, this course includes translations from the target language into the mother tongue and dictation.

We offer the translation course in combination with a General Language Course. After the morning classes you have 5 or 10 classes per week translation exercises in the afternoon.

One-to-one Courses

Times, number of lessons, duration of the course and its contents are designed according to your wishes.

This is certainly the most effective way of learning a language. The teacher considers your specific needs and wishes (grammar, conversation, phonetics, correspondence, telephone calls, discussions, ...).

Accommodation

Students have the following options (always single rooms, twin rooms on request):

- in our own **student residence** in the same building:
 - 24 single and twin rooms with en suite bathroom
 - 13 single and twin rooms in shared flats and studios
- **homestay** (with breakfast or half-board)

Availability varies according to the time of year and will be allocated on a first-come first-served basis.

Homestay accommodation: we expect the student to adapt to the family's way of life and routine. The families are located in residential areas and usually not further away from the school in the city centre than 20 minutes by bus or bike.

Arrival/Departure

100 Euro security deposit/bond are charged from all those students who book accommodation through us. The easiest way to do it: credit card reservation. The amount can also be added to the payment or can be paid cash upon arrival.

Student residence: Students who book a room in our residence are expected on Sunday evening between 5 and 7 pm at the school.

Homestay: You get your homestay address about a week before the arrival. Host families expect the student on Sunday evening, not earlier than 5 p.m.

The student has to inform the host family in advance about his arrival time.

Students don't need to bring any sheets or bed linen along. They do need to bring towels.

Arrival: Sunday not earlier than 5 pm.

Departure: Saturday not later than 10 am.

In case of delay or if the day of arrival will be another day, we give you a contact phone number of a student living in our student residence the week before to let your client in.

Extra Nights: student residence: 20 €
homestay with breakfast 30 €
homestay with half-board 40 €

Useful information

Which accommodation?

We are often asked: Which accommodation do you recommend? Our standard answer is: That's hard to say as we do not know you, what kind of person you are, etc. But, generally speaking, we have had the experience during the past years that our students liked our **student residence** most. A wide-spread opinion says that homestay offers the best possibilities if you want to learn and practice German in authentic surroundings. This is certainly true for 12, 14 or 16 year old teenagers but not necessarily for young adults between 18 and 30. They want to – and should – be with people their age.

We are happy to have **our own on-site residence** in the school building. There are single and double rooms (only non-smoker!), partly with private shower/toilet and kitchen in common usage, partly within small apartments with bathroom/kitchen in common usage. Free WiFi is available everywhere.

There are also some computers for common usage, a washing machine, a dryer, a small library and a TV-room (some TVs can be rent on request).

In order to guarantee cleanliness and silence we request the inhabitants to follow the house rules, which they will be sent with our confirmation.

In such a setting it is very easy for foreigners to **establish contacts** with other people their age. **These are the reasons why we recommend residence accommodation.**

Family accommodation/homestay (with breakfast or with half-board) is the other accommodation type we offer. The families serve the local Bavarian food they eat and which foreigners usually like very much.

Our families offer homestay mainly because they like to have people from other countries in their home, not to profit from them. And they enjoy having meals together with them, yet they don't want to be obliged to offer a full meal every day.

Our typical family pattern: Parents between 30 and 40 with small children or parents between 50 and 70 without children. Young people in Germany usually leave their parents' home and have their own flat when they are 18 or when they go to university.

Another good way to find accommodation in Regensburg (especially in high season) is to book a **holiday home**. Search for "**Ferienwohnung Regensburg**".





Welcome!

Class schedule: Mo - Fr from 9:00 to 12:30 with a break between 10:30 and 11:00. Intensive lessons in the afternoon from 13.30 or to be agreed upon. You will receive the textbooks for your classes from us, and we also have dictionaries, grammar textbooks available for purchase.

Student Residence: We are not a hotel and there is no reception, therefore it's the students' responsibility to maintain a respectful noise level and cleanliness. Everyone must clean the kitchen after using it, carefully separate the waste and recycling, and deposit it in the correct containers (see the cleaning plan on the bulletin board).

Be respectful towards your fellow students next door! Use earphones when listening to music.

It must be **absolutely quiet after 23.00!**

If you have any problems, please contact us in the office.

Departure, refund of your security deposit: Your room (and the fridge) must be clean and empty (no waste, no cloths, no food) on Saturday, the day of departure, by 12 o'clock.

We will refund your deposit by bank transfer or credit note to your credit card.

Internet: Each room has free internet access. **Downloads** of music or films are illegal.

WLAN password: **H0riz0nteH0me (0 = zero!).**

Post offices are across the cathedral and next to the railway station.

Food and Tipping: There are a lot of cafés, bars and restaurants in the city centre next to the school with special lunchtime offers (from about 8 €). Please don't forget to give a **tip** (~5%).

Most of the grocery stores are open Mo - Sa, from 9:00 to 20:00: **Netto** (Arnulfplatz), **Edeka** in the basement of **Galeria Kaufhof**, **Edeka** inside the train station (also open on Su until 20:00).

Shopping malls: **Arcaden** opposite the train station, and **DEZ** ("Donaeinkaufszentrum").

Public Transportation: You can get weekly and monthly bus tickets at the RVV center (Hemauerstraße, near the train station; sorry, no discount!).

Welcome to the HORIZONTE residence! So that you and your fellow students can get the most out of your stay here, we kindly ask you to abide by the following

House rules

Noise level: This is a wonderful place to learn German and we would like to guarantee this opportunity to everybody, therefore

**absolute silence after 23.00;
No parties! No loud music!**

Smoking and any kind of fire: Strictly forbidden in the entire building

(including the balconies): therefore no candles, no incense sticks, no hookahs!

Kitchen 4th floor: May be used between 8.00 and 22.00 o'clock by those who live on the 4th floor only. Please do the dishes immediately after cooking and eating.

Respect: Please be nice and courteous to your fellow students and don't wake them up with loud noises late at night or early in the morning. When you come home late at night, be quiet and go to your room immediately.

Garbage: Must be separated for recycling.

there are different containers in the kitchen for

- paper
- plastic and metal (cans, milk/juice cartons)
- kitchen and other garbage must be taken down (by the cleaning service of the day) EVERY DAY into the container in the court yard.
- glass: Please take your empty glasses and bottles to the next glass container at Kassiansplatz next to Galeria Kaufhof. Do not leave empty glasses/bottles in the kitchen.

Your **individual garbage** from your room is also to be taken down into the court by yourself.

Cleaning service: Every day 2 students of the 4th floor (look at the cleaning schedule on the message board) are in charge of cleaning the kitchen and tables at about 10 pm and of taking the kitchen rubbish down into the court yard (if necessary the recycling bags and paper, too).

The kitchen (including the washing machine and drier) must not be used after 22.00.

Your room:

Keep it clean.

Do not move the furniture.

No scotch tape on the walls.

Clogged waterpipes/sink/toilet: let us know immediately!

Into the toilet: nothing but toilet paper, no feminine products (repair costs: about 100 €)!

Please help us save energy (and costs) and turn off the light, computer etc. when you don't use it.



Central Heating (very, very expensive!) The radiator should be kept warm, not hot. If you feel cold, turn it up, but don't forget to turn it down again.

If you keep the window open (you shouldn't in winter), you must turn the heating off!

Ventilation and Fresh Air in Winter: Open the window wide for a couple of minutes and then close it again completely. Turn the heating off, when you open the window.

Never ever keep the window open when the heating is on.

Safety: Never ever let anybody into the residence you don't know. Don't open if somebody rings your bell (put it on "mute", unless you are expecting somebody).

Guests: If you have a guest, you are responsible for his/her behavior.

If you have a friend or relative who wants to stay overnight: We must know beforehand!

Guests do not use the kitchen.

Downloads of music or films are illegal

Key lost? Sorry: 50 €

Please follow these rules so that everybody may enjoy his/her stay

If you do not abide by these rules, you will lose your right of accommodation in the residence.

Under these circumstances there will be no refund.

Your room is regularly checked while you are in class.

Visa:

Nationals of various countries (mostly African and Asian) need a visa in order to enter Germany. Please check visa requirements before enrolment (www.auswaertiges-amt.de). For the purposes of the visa, our standard course is treated as an intensive course as the extra afternoon classes (on phonetics, history etc.) are counted as an integral part of the course.

Arrival:

If you arrive by train:

The school is at 1 km or 15 min. walking distance from the railway station.

A taxi costs about 10 Euro.

Public Transport:

Most of the families live in residential areas which are located about 15 minutes by bus from the city centre. Most of the student residences are not in the city centre, but cheap and short (ca. 15 minutes) bus rides are available. The bus fare is ca. 18 Euro per week and ca. 50 Euro per month.

Lessons & Timetable:

The lessons take place in our premises at Rote-Hahnen-Gasse 12.

Standard course: 9.00 - 12.30 (10.30 - 11.00 break);

Afternoon classes (Intensive courses, Business German, Translation Courses, ...):

13.30 - 15.30 on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday,

13.30 - 15.00 on Friday, no classes on Wednesday afternoon!

Special arrangements with the instructor are possible.

Books:

Students will receive the books and other learning materials used in class. Dictionaries, grammar and exercise books are for sale only.



Eating & Drinking:

There are lots of bars, cafés, restaurants and bakeries next to the school in the city centre. A meal including a beverage costs min. 10 Euro (a cup of coffee ca. 3 Euro, a glass of beer, juice, mineral water, coke ca 4 Euro). Please don't forget to give a tip: 5-10%.

Climate and Weather:

The climate in this part of Bavaria is moderate, not too cold, not too warm. It can rain at any time of the year. In winter, it can have snow with temperatures between -10 and +10°C, and in summer it can have all kinds of weather: hot days over 30°C, cloudy weather or rain - and sometimes everything within one week!

"Regensburg" does not mean "castle of rain". It rains like in all places around, not more and not less.

Sports:

Swimming: Westbad (outdoor and indoor pools). Our students get reduced student fares.

In summer, students can go to the river Danube or by bike to some nearby lakes which are ideal for swimming.

Football (soccer), jogging meetings according to interest and weather.

There are various possibilities for tennis, badminton and squash.

If you want to go hiking in the Alps during the weekend, it takes you only 2 hours by car to interesting sites.


